SOME USEFUL INFORMATION ABOUT THE MA ANGLISTIK/AMERIKANISTIK:

Students can choose between three specialisations:

- General (Literary and Cultural Studies and Linguistics)
- . Literary and Cultural Studies
- Linguistics

Students choose a specialisation simply by choosing modules from the respective field (linguistics or literary and cultural studies).

BEGINNING OF THE SEMESTER - WHAT SHOULD I DO FIRST?

- have a look at the information available about the M.A. Anglistik/ Amerikanistik (Modulbeschreibungen, Musterstudienplan) in Friedolin (in German) or on the department's homepage (in English)
- check the classes offered in the winter term in Friedolin here (either via "Modulkataloge" or "Vorlesungsverzeichnis"); you should enroll via "Modulkataloge"
- if you want to access Friedolin in English, change the language (see top left on the Friedolin page) "Modulkataloge" = "Browse module descriptions", "Vorlesungsverzeichnis" = "Schedule of classes".

WHERE DO I FIND THE MODULE DESCRIPTIONS — MODULBE-SCHREIBUNGEN?

The Modulkatalog (PDF here) contains the module descriptions (in German). It provides all the information you need to know about modules, including requirements and the type of exam you have to take. You can find an overview in English here

WHAT TYPES OF CLASSES ARE THERE?

The MA modules usually take the form of seminars, which require active participation, group work and presentations. A small number of courses take the from of lectures. Modules consist of weekly 90 minute classes. An exception are the 'Forschungsmodule', they consist of two weekly 90 minute classes. You should choose at least two Forschungsmodule in the course of your studies. Regular attendance is expected!

DO I HAVE TO CHOOSE MODULES IN A PARTICULAR ORDER?

No. But there is a recommendation which serves as a good example for organizing your studies (Musterstudienplan—see next page)

The programme consists of:

- 60 credits linguistics and/or literary (and cultural) studies modules
- 30 credits language practice modules
- 30 credits master's thesis.

HOW MANY CLASSES SHOULD I TAKE IN ONE TERM?

You should make sure you reach 30 credits (Leistungspunkte) each semester. Generally, one module is worth 5 credits, only the 'Forschungsmodule' (= 2 seminars,) are worth 10 credits. The fourth semester can be entirely devoted to writing the master's thesis.

WHICH CLASSES SHOULD I CHOOSE?

There are compulsory and optional modules. All language practice modules (*Grammar*, *Academic Writing*, *Oral Presentation*, and *Advanced Language Skills A* and *B* and *C*) are compulsory. They add up to a total of 30 credit points. You should choose two language practice modules in your first, two language practice modules in your second, and two language practice modules in your third term.

All linguistics modules and all literary (and cultural) studies modules are optional modules. The modules you choose in linguistics and/or literary and cultural studies should add up to 20 credits per term; they must finally add up to 60 credit points to finish the programme.

You can choose a module only once!

ARE ALL CLASSES TAUGHT IN ENGLISH?

In general, yes. Only when seminars are taught in cooperation with other departments, the language of instruction is sometimes German. This will be indicated in the course description in Friedolin (Vorlesungsverzeichnis).

CAN I TAKE CLASSES THAT ARE OFFERED BY OTHER DEPART-MENTS?

Yes. You can choose modules from related master programmes (instead of modules offered by the Department of English/American Studies) such as M.A. Germanistische Sprachwissenschaft, M.A. Indogermanistik, M.A. Neuere Geschichte, M.A. Volkskunde/ Kulturgeschichte, M.A. Literatur-Kunst-Kultur, M.A. Politikwissenschaft. The respective modules must be listed in the Modulkatalog/Modulbeschreibungen of the MA Anglistik/Amerikanistik. Students can choose modules up to a total of 30 credit points from these programmes.

The classes offered by other departments are usually taught in German!

CAN I TAKE CLASSES OFFERED BY OTHER DEPARTMENTS IF THE RESPECTIVE MODULES ARE NOT LISTED IN THE MODULKATA-LOG OF THE MA ANGLISTIK/AMERIKANISTIK?

Yes. Most departments offer "Zusatzmodule", i.e. you can choose one of their modules as an additional module. But you <u>cannot acquire credits</u> through a Zusatzmodul!

HOW DO I REGISTER FOR CLASSES?

You need to register for classes online (in Friedolin). In the winter term 24/25 you must register by Sunday, October 6, as the first automatic placement will be on October 7.

The number of students per course is limited and it could be possible that the system (Friedolin) does not accept you. Make sure to check on or after October 7 whether you can participate in enough classes to acquire 30 credits. If not, please contact the professors or choose another class. There will be a second placement on Thursday, October 10, to distribute the last open spaces.

Students are responsible for their own schedules. If you encounter difficulties please speak to the professors immediately or contact the student mentor Carleen Hoppema: carleen.hoppema@uni-jena.de

WHAT HAPPENS IF I AM ADMITTED TO MORE CLASSES THAN I NEED AFTER THE FIRST (OR SECOND) PLACEMENT?

Please sign out of the class immediately so that another student can get your spot. If you decide to drop a class you should do that not later than the first week and inform the instructor.

It is possible to sign out of a class as long as you have not registered for the module exams. Make sure that you have a substitution in order to reach the required 30 credits per term.

ARE CLASSES TAUGHT ONLINE?

The department offers only few classes fully online. If classes are taught online, this is indicated in Friedolin.

WHAT DOES ONLINE TEACHING MEAN?

In general this means that seminars take the form of video conferences and teaching materials are provided online. Teachers usually use <u>Zoom</u> for online classes and they offer access to teaching materials through the e-learning platform Moodle.

WHAT IS MOODLE?

Moodle is the university's <u>e-learning platform</u>. It is used by most teachers of the Department of English and American Studies to provide students with teaching and learning materials (readings, videos, links, etc.). As soon as you have been admitted ("zugelassen") to a class by Friedolin you should have access to the respective Moodle room. But you need a university login (URZ login/FSU account) to actually access Moodle!

Please read your emails and check your FSU account regularly!

WHAT IF I CANNOT COMPLETE MY REGISTRATION (IMMATRIKULATION) BEFORE OCTOBER 9 AND DO NOT HAVE A STUDENT ACCOUNT?

If you do not have a student account by October 9, you can still enroll in classes after your registration with the International Office is complete and you have received the information you need to create a FSU account. You can enroll for a class through Friedolin as soon as you have a FSU account. Make sure to also send an email to the teacher when you enroll through Friedolin. First check whether there are still places available in the classes you are interested in!

HOW CAN I REGISTER FOR AN EXAM AND CAN I CANCEL A REGIST-RATION?

You can only take an exam if you have registered for it. You must register in Friedolin (not later than December 23, 2024, in the winter term 24/25). After the registration period (i.e. after December 23) you can cancel a registration until two weeks before the exam date by submitting a request at ASPA (see ASPA homepage for form). Later than that it is possible to cancel an examination only in exceptional cases. In order to do so you need to make a written request and hand it in (ASPA). In the event of illness on the day of the examination you need to see a doctor and bring the doctor's certificate (you have to contact ASPA). If you have registered and do not take an exam it will count as 'fail' (nicht bestanden).

CAN I REPEAT AN EXAM?

If you have failed an exam for the first time, you can repeat it once. There are fixed dates for the resit exams. If you have failed twice you can take an exam a third time <u>once</u> in the course of your studies. Apart from that, you can make a written request (Härtefallantrag) to ASPA and apply for taking an exam a third time. But there need to be specific reasons and you need to provide information to justify the request. If you have failed a module from 'Wahlpflichtbereich' you have the chance to substitute it <u>once</u> throughout your studies with another module from 'Wahlpflichtbereich'.

WHAT TYPES OF FXAMS ARE THERE?

You will either have to take a written exam (usually 90 minutes) or you will have to hand in a term paper (approximately 15 to 20 pages). The format of the exam (e.g. 'Klausur' = written exam) is fixed and can be found on 'Friedolin' and in the 'Modulbeschreibungen'.

There are deadlines for term papers. Papers submitted after the deadline will be graded 'fail'.
